### **One-day course: seminars & interactive workshops**

Rapid Response Systems (RRSs) are a leading approach for hospital based patient-safety with a significant body of evidence for reduction of adverse patients' related outcomes including cardio-pulmonary arrests.

This one-day course for clinicians & administrators aims to familiarise participants with the evidence base and methodology.

**Format:** Introductory lectures followed by workshops, questions and answers sessions, group exercises, meet the experts and real case discussions.

**Objective:** Basic introduction to a standardised methodology to implement hospital based patients' safety through innovations, technology and tools such as a rapid response system.
